## What is severe eosinophilic asthma?



**Eosinophilic asthma is a particular type of severe asthma, where patients have increased eosinophil levels in the blood and/or lungs.**



**Eosinophils are a type of white blood cells that are associated with inflammation of the airways.**



## What is FASENRA®?

FASENRA® is used to treat severe eosinophilic asthma, in combination with other asthma medications. FASENRA® helps reduce the number of asthma attacks that you experience.

FASENRA® is not used to treat other problems caused by eosinophils, or to treat sudden breathing problems.

## How does FASENRA® work?

FASENRA® contains the active substance, benralizumab, a monoclonal antibody that works by affecting eosinophils.



## Getting started with FASENRA®

You will receive a welcome call from your Connect360° Patient Support Program Care Coordinator. They will complete your enrollment, answer any questions, and help you get started on treatment.



### 1. Your First Call

In preparation for this call, you should have the following ready:

- Your health insurance information.
- Your medical history for the past year, including the number of hospitalizations and emergency room visits, and your use of oral corticosteroids.
- A list of all your asthma medications for the past 3 years (available from your pharmacist).

Note: The caller ID may appear as "Connect360" and/or "1-833-360-2666," so make sure to answer the telephone if you see these details.



### 2. Insurance Navigation

After your call, the Connect360° Patient Support Program will submit and process your coverage of FASENRA® through your health insurance provider and will contact you again to discuss next steps.



### 3. Your First Injection

Once your insurance coverage has been determined, the Connect360° Patient Support Program will schedule an appointment for your first FASENRA® injection, as well as injection training should you be self-administering your subsequent doses.

You and your doctor will decide if you should self-inject FASENRA®. You or your caregiver will receive training on the right way to prepare and inject FASENRA®.

## How will I receive FASENRA®?

FASENRA® is given as an injection just under the skin (subcutaneously).

You and your doctor will decide where you should receive your FASENRA® injections:



If your doctor decides you or your caregiver can inject FASENRA®, you or your caregiver will receive training on how to correctly administer FASENRA®.

## How often do I take FASENRA®?



Over your first year of treatment, you will receive a total of 8 injections.

## What are the possible side effects of FASENRA®?

Like all medications, FASENRA® can cause some side effects, although not everybody will get them.

### Common side effects (may affect up to 1 in 10 people):

**Allergic reactions** may occur within minutes to hours after an injection, but can sometimes start several days later.

Symptoms of an allergic reaction can include:

- swelling of your face, eyelids, lips, tongue, or mouth
- difficulty breathing, very wheezy, cough, chest tightness
- fainting, dizziness, or feeling lightheaded (due to a drop in blood pressure)
- hives
- rash

It's important to seek medical attention immediately if you think you may be having an allergic reaction.

### Other common side effects that may occur with FASENRA® include:

- headache
- sore throat
- fever
- injection site reactions (e.g., pain, redness, itching, or swelling where the injection was given)

**If you have a troublesome symptom or side effect not listed here or becomes bad enough to interfere with your daily activities, tell your healthcare professional.**

**To help avoid side effects, talk to your healthcare professional before you take FASENRA®.** Talk about any health conditions or problems you may have, including if you:

- have had any symptoms of an allergic reaction, including to other medicines of this type as they can cause severe allergic reactions when injected into the body. Serious allergic reactions have occurred in patients receiving FASENRA®.
- have a parasitic infection, if you live in an area where parasitic infections are common, or if you are travelling to such a region. FASENRA® may weaken your ability to fight certain types of parasitic infections. Parasitic infections should be treated prior to starting treatment with FASENRA®.
- feel that your asthma symptoms get worse while receiving FASENRA®.

### Pregnancy and breastfeeding:

- If you are pregnant, think you may be pregnant or are planning to become pregnant, tell your doctor before taking FASENRA®. It is preferable to avoid the use of FASENRA® during pregnancy.
- If you become pregnant while taking FASENRA® or within 4 months of stopping treatment, tell your doctor right away.
- If you are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed, tell your doctor before taking FASENRA®.

Tell your healthcare professional about all the medications you take, including any drugs, vitamins, minerals, natural supplements or alternative medicine.



## Frequently asked questions

### How do I prepare for my first FASENRA® injection appointment?

Ask your doctor or Connect360° Patient Support Program Care Coordinator if you need to bring any documents to your injection appointment. If you have any concerns about injections or needles, ask for tips that may help you cope with it.

### What should I do if I miss a FASENRA® injection?

If you have missed a FASENRA® injection, contact your doctor as soon as possible and contact the Connect360° Patient Support Program at 1-833-360-CONNECT (833-360-2666), Mon–Fri, 8 am–8 pm EST. They can advise you on when to take your next dose.

### What happens if I stop taking FASENRA®?


Do not stop taking FASENRA® unless advised by your doctor. Interrupting or stopping treatment with FASENRA® may cause your asthma symptoms to become worse or cause an asthma attack.

### Do I need to continue taking my other asthma medications?

FASENRA® is used together with other medications to treat asthma. Do not suddenly stop taking your other asthma medications once you have started FASENRA®. These medications (especially corticosteroids) must be stopped gradually, under the supervision of your doctor.
